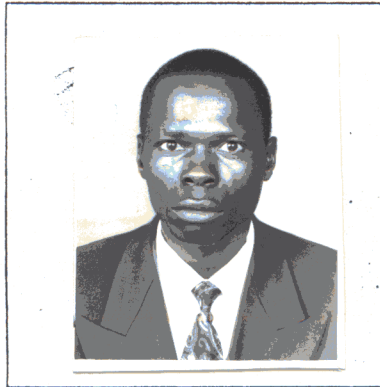

1. Please write a detailed testimony of your salvation, and call to the ministry.

I got saved on 15th September 1989 during a three-day-crusade which was organised by the West Pokot Bible Baptist Fellowship. After I heard the message on the "Love of God" I was strongly touched, whereby I did realise how lost I was, and I took a step to respond to the invitation after which I was led to the Lord by one of the pastors. Previously, I had depended on baptismal regeneration, it was until this day, that I knew what it meant to have an experience at the new birth. I felt much peace in my heart, I went to church the following Sunday (the Kenya BBC) and there after two weeks I accepted to follow the Lord in a believers' baptism.
