TESTIMONY

I thank the Lord Jesus who is my Savior. My name is Yona Melau Kosia. I was born in a pagan family in the year 1973. I was able to attend primary school. My parents before I was saved were pagans but I thank the Lord Jesus because they are now saved.

I received Jesus Christ as my personal savior. I was able to hear the message preached by some evangelists who visited our village and preached about how sinful we human beings are and the need of a Savior. The preacher used John 3:16 – 17 and after hearing the message I decided to invite Jesus into my life. I was instructed to join the church for more teachings as a way of getting preparation to get baptized. I was baptized later.

My parents who then were pagans were not happy when they heard in the first time that I gave my life to Jesus. Since they were pagans, they forced me and other children to join them in their pagan practices such as worship to their ancestors.

After some times in the church, I received a call to tell others about the need of confessing their sins and to receive Jesus Christ in their lives. Later the church appointed me as their evangelist. I used to witness to the lost and to visit other churches with church choir and share the message of the Gospel. It is my prayer that God may keep using me as His vessel of telling others about His saving power. Until this time I serve the Lord as an evangelist.

After I kept receiving teaching and reading the Bible which is the Word of God I came to realize the truth which is in it. My doctrinal statement is based on what I can find in the Bible. I wake up in the morning and do prayers at 6.00 am take tea and start my schedule at 8.00 am. At 8.00 am we go to our farm and work there for 4 hours and come back home at 12.00 pm. On other days we have to look for people who have extra farming work to hire us and pay us a little amount of money. We take our lunch, sometime stay without. From 3.00pm to 5.00 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, I go to church for prayers or choir. On Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays I visit people and tell them about Jesus. Sunday is a worship day.

23 - Describe your wife's typical daily schedule.

Most of my wife's schedule is related with mine. Except sometimes I can leave her at home doing some other home activities.

Yes I do grow some food crops and buy other food. Most of family food is bought.
